This year I am honored in nominating BOB AVERY, member of the Bundaberg SFC for the past 3 to 4 years. Bob and Di have recently moved back to Townsville to live and has now hooked up with Hinchinbrook SFC. He has always remained a member of ANSA and North Queensland Fly Fishers.

HISTORY

In the Early 1980's Bob joined the ANSA QLD ARMY SFC. Over that time, he enjoyed fishing the light line divisions as did all ANSA members in the 80's and 90's He became a very accomplished angler in all aspects from ESTUARY, BLUEWATER and FRESHWATER as well as LANDBASED, SPORT and LURECASTING divisions. This led onto FLYFISHING and becoming a member of the NORTH QLD FLY FISHERS.

Upon retirement Bob and Wife Di who was also a well- known angler in her own right, took off around Australia on a well- earned holiday TWICE, then headed to Tasmania for a quick run before returning back to Qld and into the running of another ANSA Club, Bundaberg SFC where he took over the Club Recorders job and helped organize Club events keeping them up to date with ANSA State issues. Bob achieved many records in both LINECLASS in many divisions, LENGTH ONLY and TAGGING. More recently Bob has become more involved with

assisting the ANSA Qld state committee, lending a hand in updating our eligible SPECIES' list and the ANSA Qld hand book, as well as help forming the ANSA FLY group.

He has been involved in ANSA for many years and his knowledge is invaluable. Whenever I need a second opinion on Species or changes which need to be assessed he is available.
